Why does being at a festival seem to encourage this sort of behaviour?


We know that there is a lot of Audience support for environmental initiatives at festivals.

"Have you ever changed your day to day behaviour as a result of environmental initiatives or ideas you have learned at a festival."









CROWD MANAGEMENT ...

"... is defined as the systematic planning for, and supervision of, the orderly movement and assembly of people "
(Fruin, 1993)





CROWD MANAGEMENT ...

"... contributes to a good event atmosphere as people are satisfied, happy and enjoy the event"

(Fruin, 1993)

What we know about the way crowds behave?

A crowd is a large number of people who gather together with a common short-term or long-term purpose.

Sociologist Herbert Blumer (1969) developed a popular typology of crowds based on their purpose and dynamics.

- · casual crowds
- conventional crowds,
- expressive crowds
- acting crowds.







NORMATIVE SOCIAL INFLUENCE: THE NEED TO BE ACCEPTED

Normative conformity often results in public compliance without private acceptance.
